**GOVERNMENT MOTIONS**

1. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #69)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work collaboratively with the Government of Canada, the Government of the Northwest Territories, the Porcupine Caribou Management Board, all affected First Nations in Yukon and the Northwest Territories, and stakeholders, to develop a Porcupine Caribou Herd Harvest Management Strategy that ensures to the greatest extent possible, the conservation and protection of the Porcupine Caribou Herd.

2. Hon. Mr. Fentie (Motion #167)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada and Yukon First Nation governments to develop a timely, inclusive process through the re-instated Intergovernmental Forum to implement the recommendations of the Nine Year Review of the Yukon Final Land Claims Agreements in order to ensure the spirit and intent of the land claims agreements are fulfilled.

3. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #194)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon and the Yukon Registered Nurses Association to continue working together on the development of legislation that will allow Nurse Practitioners to work within their full scope of practice.

4. Hon. Mr. Kenyon (Motion #239)

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to continue to work with the Government of Canada, First Nations, Yukon College, members of the business community and non-governmental organizations to:

- (1) enhance and develop labour market initiatives targeting First Nations, older workers, youth, persons with disabilities and immigrants through measures such as

- apprenticeship programs, the Youth Employment Program, the Yukon Nominee Program, the Temporary Foreign Worker Program and other programs,
- (2) develop a national recruiting campaign; and
  - (3) assist in the development of retention incentives for employers.
5. Hon. Mr. Cathers (Motion #357)
- THAT this House urges the Department of Health and Social Services to launch a new health promotion initiative to:
- (1) further assist Yukoners who wish to quit smoking by funding a portion of the cost of nicotine replacement therapies; and
  - (2) work in partnership with the Motor Vehicles Branch to provide drivers with information on the increased health impacts of smoking within the confined space of a motor vehicle.

**NOTICES OF MOTION  
MOTIONS OTHER THAN GOVERNMENT MOTIONS**

1. Mr. Fairclough (Motion #618)

That this House urges the Minister of Education to bring forth amendments to the *Education Act*, as is required by law, in order that;

- (1) the recommendations of the *Education Act* Review committee may be considered,
- (2) the recommendations of the Education Reform Project may be considered ,
- (3) the recommendations of New Horizons Project may be considered; and
- (4) Yukoners can be empowered to be a part of their children's education.

2. Mr. Edzerza (Motion #619)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to invest in expanded home care, community support programs, and supported/assisted living in order to keep individuals out of the acute care and facility-based long-term care system and to provide a better level of appropriate services at a lower cost.

3. Mr. Edzerza (Motion #620)

THAT this House urges the Minister of Health and Social Services to provide the Chair and Board of the Yukon Hospital Corporation with an annual letter of expectation that improves accountability by:

- (1) providing the Yukon Hospital Board with a written mandate,
- (2) articulating the Minister's expectation for the Board; and
- (3) outlining the Minister's obligations to the Yukon Hospital Corporation.

4. Mr. Cardiff (Motion #621)

THAT this House urges the Yukon Government to work with the RCMP and the Kluane First Nation to continue a pilot project in the summer of 2009 to provide a full-time police presence in the community of Burwash Landing.
